

April 7, 2003

The Strasburg Township Board of Supervisors held its regular meeting on Monday evening, April 7, 2003, at 7:30, at the Township municipal building. Present were Peg Dearolf, Daniel Herr, and Thomas Willig.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 3, 2003, were approved.

Sewage Enforcement Officer Marvin Stoner gave his report.

Anita Bowers, **Providence Ambulance** president, and Kenneth Dull from the Providence Ambulance Board signed the annual contract and received a \$3000.00 contribution from the Township. They reported that they are still a volunteer organization. Paid staff from Willow Street Ambulance cover during the day, but nights and weekends are staffed by volunteers. In Strasburg Township they serve the area along Route 222, Breneman Road, and part of White Oak Road.

Scott Weichler, **Strasburg Fire Company** president, Bob Devonshire, chief, and Willis Lefever, Jr., treasurer, received a \$6,250.00 contribution from the Township. They reported on the 2002 activity of the fire company and plans for a new fire house on South Jackson Street in the Borough.

Zoning Officer Tom Long reported that the **Strasburg Polo Club** has submitted a drawing showing the 10-acre area being used by the Club on the Dale High property along Route 222. The pavilion will be built after LCPC has reviewed and approved the application for a waiver of land development. There was a discussion of the traffic study, that it should show the peak traffic when the club is in use, not a daily average. On a motion by Willig/Dearolf, the Supervisors voted to recommend the waiver request. Isaac Lapp is applying to the ZHB for a farm occupation entirely inside the barn with storage allowed only under the shed roof behind the barn. He has obtained permits for the construction of the shed roof and the outdoor wood furnace which heats the home and barn. The Supervisors agreed with the conditions for the business proposed by the Township solicitor.

Herr, Dearolf and Long reported on the public hearing held by the L-S Rec Commission on the proposed **Rec Center** to be built in West Lampeter's new park. Dearolf commented that all the facilities should be under one roof rather than the plan presented by the architect with several buildings. The plan provides for rental use by clubs and professionals. Herr said that each municipality will decide if they will participate in the project and each will hold a public hearing. Jason Miller, Main Street, Refton, said that he thought people would not want to pay higher taxes for such a facility.

The **Strasburg Rail Road** and Strasburg Borough Authority will attend the Supervisors' meeting on May 5, 2003.

After approving checks to be signed in the amount of \$26,619.35, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.
