AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN QUARRYVILLE BOROUGH AND STRASBURG TOWNSHIP RELATING TO THE PROVISION BY THE BOROUGH OF LIMITED POLICE SERVICES WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP.

WHEREAS, Quarryville Borough (the "Borough") and Strasburg Township (the "Township") are municipalities within southern Lancaster County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has established a police department (the "Borough Police Department") to provide police protection services within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Township does not have a police department and principally relies on the Pennsylvania State Police for police protection; and

WHEREAS, the Township desires to obtain police services from the Borough Police Department for traffic control and enforcement on certain roadways;

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 53 Pa. C.S. §2301 et seq., permits municipalities to enter into agreements to cooperate in the performance of their respective functions, powers or responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the Borough and the Township desire to enter into an agreement to permit Borough police officers to perform limited police services within the Township and to enact an ordinance to authorize execution of such an agreement.

BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Strasburg, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

Section 1. The caption of and recitals to this Ordinance as set forth above are incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Strasburg Township shall join with Quarryville Borough in accordance with the Pennsylvania Intergovernmental Cooperation Act by entering into the Intermunicipal Agreement which is adopted by reference with the same effect as if it had been set out verbatim

in this Section and a copy of which shall be filed with the minutes of the meeting at which this Ordinance was enacted.

- Section 3. This Township is authorized to enter into the Intermunicipal Agreement for the purposes contained therein. This action is to be taken by the officials or employees of the Township designated for this purpose, pursuant to general or specific instructions issued by the Board of Supervisors.
- <u>Section 4.</u> As required by the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act the following matters are specifically found and determined:
 - A. The conditions of the agreement are set forth in the Intermunicipal Agreement referred to in Section 2.
 - B. The Intermunicipal Agreement shall be for an indefinite period and either party may terminate the Intermunicipal Agreement upon 30 days' notice to the other party.
 - C. The purpose and objectives of the Intermunicipal Agreement are to enter into an intergovernmental contract to permit Borough police officers to perform limited police services within the Township as described in the Intermunicipal Agreement.
 - D. The Township shall reimburse the Borough for all costs associated with Borough police officers performing traffic control and enforcement services on behalf of the Township, including, but not limited to, reimbursing the Borough for the wages of officers providing services within the Township for all time spent performing services within the Township and testifying in court and mileage for Borough police vehicles.
 - E. No entity will be formed to administer the Intermunicipal Agreement. The Borough will continue to administer the Borough Police Department.
 - F. No property, real or personal, shall be acquired, managed or disposed of under the Intermunicipal Agreement.
 - G. All police officers shall continue to be employees of the Borough.

Section 5. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable and if any section, sentence, clause, part or provision hereof shall be held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision of the court shall not affect the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, parts or provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Strasburg that this Ordinance would have been enacted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional section, sentence, clause, part or provision had not been included herein.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its enactment as provided by law.
